I was forced to leave my country due to the war in Syria. I was studying communication engineering there and when I came to Turkey, I got offered a place at Istanbul University to continue my education and joined HOPES programme to improve my skills in English language. A huge benefit of taking part in HOPES was the fact I wasn't limited with learning and studying one subject. I learnt many new skills from understanding how to write a good CV to honing my social skills through further training. HOPES provided me the opportunity to develop my English and communication skills, while learning English opened doors for me and helped me find a new job in Turkey.

My English skills developed well and I was able to demonstrate this by taking the Aptis test (which covered speaking, listening, reading and writing). Post studying, the British Council in Turkey offered me a job as an IELTS invigilator that helped me create a career path for myself.
